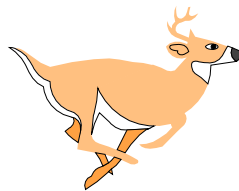
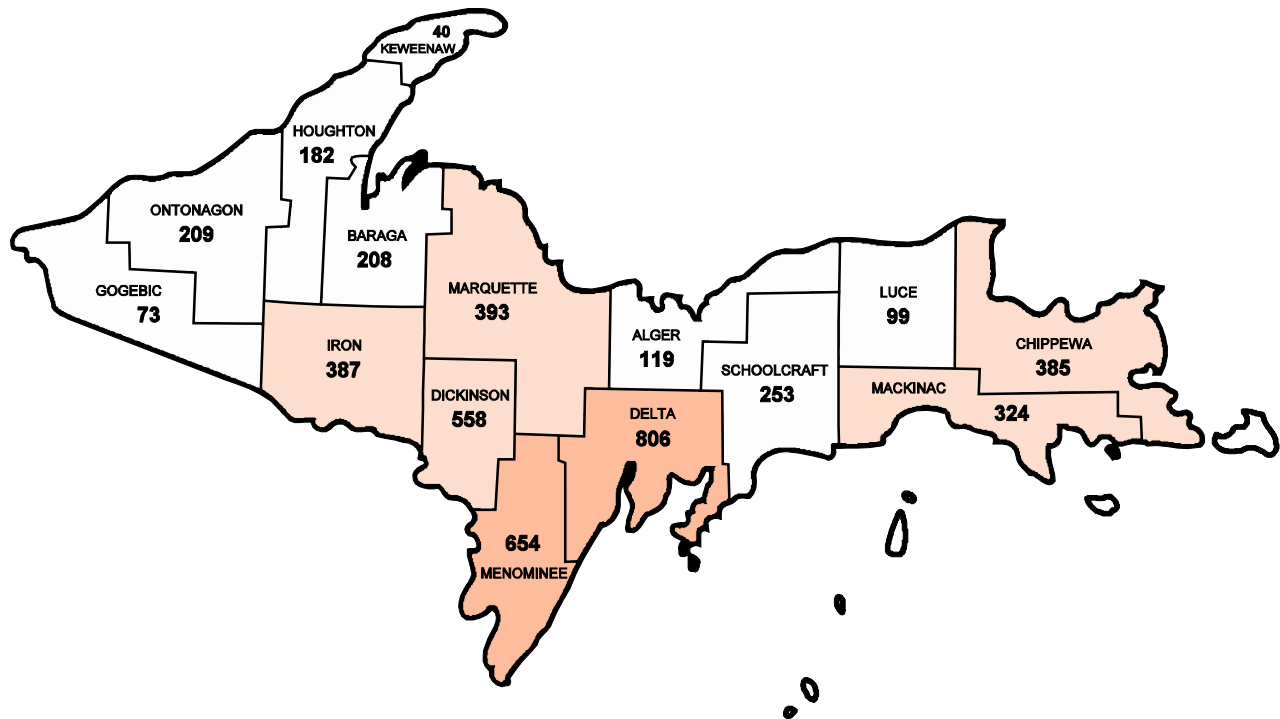




UPPER PENINSULA MOTOR VEHICLE-DEER INVOLVED CRASHES

The Upper Peninsula had 4,690 reported motor vehicle-deer crashes during 2009. 117 people were injured and 2 persons (motorcyclists) were killed as a result of those collisions. Of the 4,702 vehicles involved, 3,072 (63.3%) were passenger cars, 1,104 (23.5%) were pickups, and 299 (6.4%) were minivans, vans, and motorhomes. All other vehicle types (including motorcycle, snowmobile, ORV/ATV, large truck, moped) totaled 227 (4.8%).

In the Upper Peninsula, Delta County had the highest number of motor vehicle-deer crashes (806) in 2009. Approximately 43.0 (42.7) percent of all crashes were deer involved. This compares to 21.1 percent for the number of deer-involved crashes statewide.
